- **THOSE LADDER-BACK CHAIRS.** The 1960s seats look like little sculptures that you can sit in.

- **THAT DRUM SHADE FIXTURE.** The whole thing is wrapped in fabric, so it casts a flattering glow.

- **WALLPAPER WITH A STARRING ROLE.** The secret to pulling off this many patterns without getting dizzy is to layer different sizes: small blossoms on the wall; medium ikat on the upholstered chairs; and a wide, graphic lattice on the rug.
- **AQUA!** So surprising for dining. White would have taken the room in an entirely different—and probably dull—direction.
- **A BIGGER-THAN-USUAL RUG.** Here's a little decorating trick: Let the rug extend way beyond the chairs. It gives the illusion that the room is bigger than it really is.
